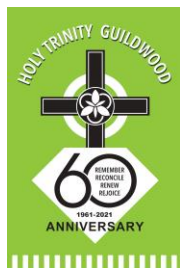

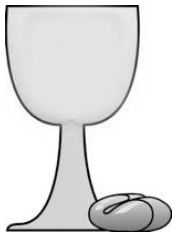

Welcome to Holy Trinity, Guildwood

At Holy Trinity, Guildwood, we welcome all who come to worship with us. Though we are people of diverse background, lifestyle, and opinion, we are one in our desire to follow Jesus Christ. We seek to live as diversity in unity, offering a community in which we can all grow together as one Body: God's Church. We hope the order of service will help you find your way, but feel free to ask your neighbour for help. We are truly pleased that you have chosen to worship with us.



Holy Communion: All are welcome in this church and at this altar. All baptized persons, including children, are invited to receive the bread and wine at Christ's table. Those not receiving communion may wish to receive a blessing. Simply cross your hands over your chest to indicate you are not receiving communion. The Anglican Church supports the ancient use of the common cup. Those receiving the chalice are asked to assist the chalice bearer by grasping the cup at the base and guiding the cup to their lips. **For health purposes the practice of intinction, dipping the bread into the wine, is discouraged.** If you do not wish to drink from the common cup, please feel free to receive the bread only. Simply cross your hands over your chest when the chalice bearer passes by to indicate you do not wish the wine. The ancient teaching is that the whole Christ is received whether one receives only the consecrated bread or both bread and wine. Please come forward (should you wish) to the altar rail, at the indication of the sides person (usher) to fill the altar rail from the outside in. Those with mobility concerns may also receive Holy Communion while remaining in place, please notify a sides person (usher).

Children are always welcome at Holy Trinity - On Sundays, children are invited to take part in the wonderful age-appropriate activities offered by Church School downstairs in the church hall during the Liturgy of the Word, after which they return upstairs to join in the Celebration of the Eucharist. Parents are always welcome to join their children for some or all of the time downstairs. First Reading

Deuteronomy 26:1-11

A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.

When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house.

A Reading from the Letter to the Romans.

"The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so

is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

The Holy Gospel

Luke 4:1-13

A modern version of the Gospel arranged for two readers. Reader 1 has lines pertaining to Jesus; Reader 2, lines pertaining to the Devil. Words in parenthesis can be spoken as asides to the audience.

Reader 1 Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan
and was led by the Spirit into the wild.

Reader 2 For forty wilderness days and nights
he was tested by the Devil.

Reader 1 He ate nothing during that time,
and when it was over he was hungry.

Reader 2 The Devil, playing on his hunger, assigned the first test.
"Since you are God's Son,
command this stone to turn into a loaf of bread."

Reader 1 Jesus answered...

Reader 2 (quoting *Deuteronomy*):

Reader 1 "It takes more than bread to really live."

Reader 2 For the second test the Devil led him up to a high place
and spread out in an instant all the kingdoms of the earth.
"They're yours, Jesus," the Devil said, "yours in all their splendour
to serve your pleasure.

I'm in charge of them all and can turn them over to whomsoever I wish.
Worship me and they're yours, the whole works."

Reader 1 Jesus refused.

Reader 2 (Again backing up his refusal with *Deuteronomy*.)

Reader 1 It is written:

"Worship the Lord your God and only the Lord your God.
Serve him with absolute single-heartedness."

Reader 2 For the third test the Devil took him to Jerusalem,

Reader 1 to the very top of the Temple.

Reader 2 (His Father's house, he called it.)
 "If you are God's Son, jump!"

Reader 1 Jesus looked down.

Reader 2 "It's written, isn't it," the Devil said,
 "He will give his angels charge over you to protect you; they'll catch you;
 you won't so much as stub your toe on a stone?"

Reader 1 "Yes," Jesus said, "and it's also written,
 'Don't you dare tempt the Lord your God.'"

Reader 2 That completed the testing. The Devil retreated
 Reader 1 (temporarily),
 Reader 2 lying in wait for another chance.



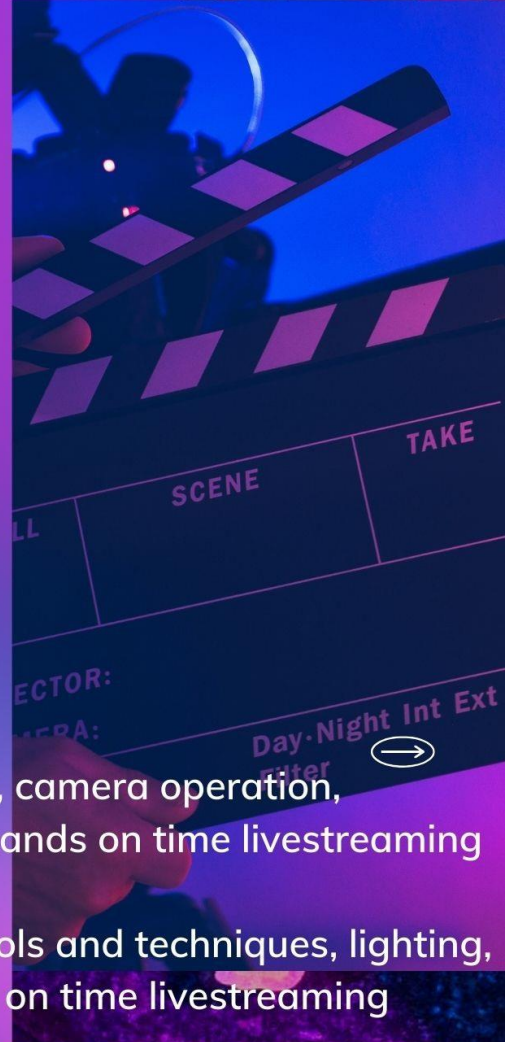

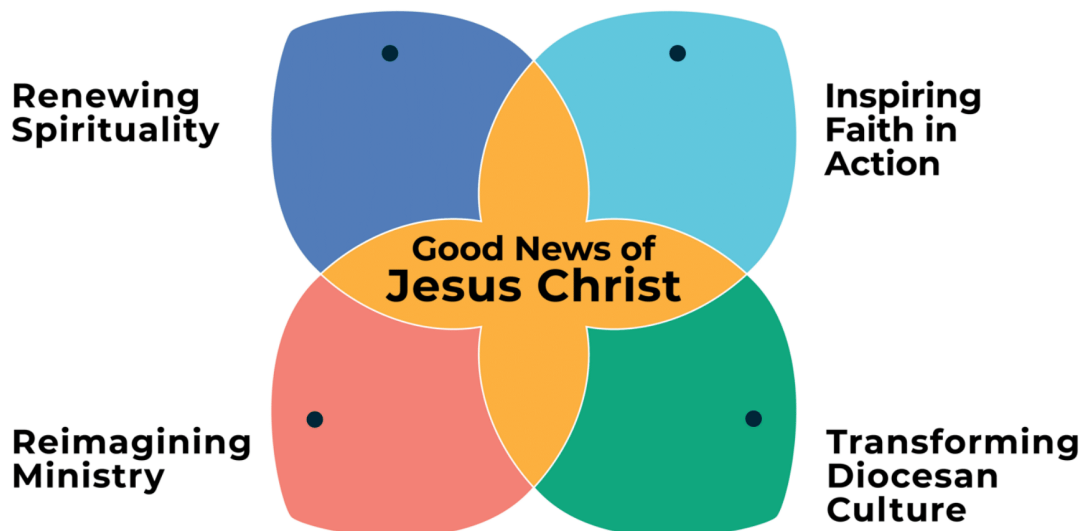
